Precinct Delegate Action

The committee is ramping up recruitment of precinct delegates and retention of the 155 current delegates, in advance of the May 7 deadline to get on the ballot for the Aug. 6 primary election.

When the new state House, Senate and federal congressional districts are implemented for the 2024 election cycle, basic precinct maps will be largely unchanged but voters will be in need of effective leadership from their precinct delegates.

Currently the GP Dems focuses on the 99 precincts and 396 delegate positions in the former state House districts 1 and 2, encompassing the eastside of Detroit, Harper Woods and the Grosse Pointes.

The committee has an important job and we welcome motivated Democrats to embrace the opportunity to be grassroots differencemakers in your neighborhoods. Committee members are Sandra Bucciero, Jeff Greer, Darci McConnell, Shannon Byrne, Addison Mauck and chairman Ed Keelean.
